Recommended for closure

Council say:	"Poor Location: Standalone, Set apart from retail area."
Residents think:	 It is a destination in its own right. It is between 2 local shopping areas, Westbury Lane & the Square. Neither of which are very busy. It is on main road, with on street parking & bus stop outside. Many people walk past it to get to bus stops, local schools & shops. It is central for both Sea Mills and Coombe Dingle Residents. Community centre behind library - could be linked up to create community hub & share toilets.
Council say:	"Relatively close to other libraries: Shirehampton & Lawrence Weston libraries"
Residents think:	 Would be a long way for young or elderly to walk. Poor bus connections. Lawrence Weston library is just one small room. Both libraries only open 4 days a week, with no late night opening. (N.B Westbury-on-Trym library also threatened with closure)
Council say:	"Building in not particularly good condition: Built in 1930's, difficult to adapt, no public toilet, cramped staff area"
Residents think:	 Large parts of north Bristol were built in 1930's too. Not a good reason to close. Redecorated & new furniture was purchased 2009. Very solid, sound building, just needs routine maintenance & has been neglected by Bristol City Council, e.g sign so faded cannot read it. Double glazing was installed few years ago. Inside light & airy space. Level access & electric doors. With imagination could adapt inside to add accessible toilet & improve staff area.
